

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park

Sunday 19th December 2021 Fourth Sunday of Advent

A year ago most of us had yet to get vaccinated; events were very limited in scale, and we hadn't seen some family for a very long time. Now we are queuing for boosters, nightclubs and theatres as well as arenas have reopened – and most of us have caught up with family during this year. But this is our second Advent in a still persistent pandemic. Our world is gripped by anxiety, by sickness, and by divisions – not least on how to deal with COVID – and how to enjoy Christmas safely. How to see our families and the people we love. In today's gospel, Mary comes to see her relative, Elizabeth. She has just made her big decision – said yes to God's plan. But now she travels to see her relative. Elizabeth is older than her, a married woman, and perhaps someone she feels she could turn to to talk through any doubts or fears about what she has just said yes to. After all it seems huge and overwhelming! And Elizabeth – and her baby – immediately react to Mary's greeting. Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit and her baby John leaps with joy. They recognise that the Messiah is here with them, already. Elizabeth –filled with the Holy Spirit – passes on the good news from God. She says that Mary is blessed - holy - and that her child too will be holy. May we too be filled with the Holy Spirit to be transmitters of God's good news, and may we encourage one another on the journey of faithfulness.

Eternal God,
as Mary waited for the birth of your Son,
so we wait for his coming in glory;
bring us through the birth pangs of this present age to see,
with her, our great salvation in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gospel Reading: Luke 1.39-45[46-55]

Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'

And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'
