Sunday 13th March 2022 Second Sunday of Lent

Our Old Testament reading for today tells of a moment of huge importance to the people of Israel. The great father of the nations, Abraham (in our passage still Abram, before he is given his new name), receives the promise and the covenant of God. It's a rich and complex story, but it hinges on two moments: Abram believing the promise, and God creating the covenant.

Abram and Sarai have no children of their own, and Abram longs for an heir. God promises that, despite appearances, he will have many offspring, as many as the stars in heaven. And Abram 'believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.' (v.6) The promises of God may at times feel impossible. The promise of peace, or of joy, of a new calling, or of purpose, may sometimes seem beyond God's capacity to deliver. And yet Abram knows the God who makes this promise, and trusts in his word. Can we do the same? Can we hold on to the promises of God, even if we fear they've passed us by, or have been taken away?

And that bring us to the second part of this narrative, as God creates his covenant with Abram: a covenant of land and people, and an unconditional covenant of blessing. This is the second covenant God has made, the first was with Noah and all of creation, the second now with Abram, and again God will covenant with his people through Moses and David. Finally, God will show the greatest covenant of all in Jesus, a new covenant in his blood. God sends his only son to die for us, and through him to offer unconditional grace and blessing to all the world. We can trust in the promises of God, because God is a God of covenantal love. A love that is pledged and sealed in Christ and that will never be removed. May our faith too, find its foundation in this God of covenant.



First Reading: Genesis 15.1-12.17-18

The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the LORD came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Then he said to him, 'I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.'

Gospel Reading: Luke 13.31-35

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, 'Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you.' He said to them, 'Go and tell that fox for me, "Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed away from Jerusalem." Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.""
