Sunday 27th March 2022 Mothering Sunday

This Sunday we mark Mothering Sunday. A day that has grown into a celebration of mothering love in all its diversity. It's not an easy day for everyone. There will be those for whom, for whatever reason, this day is a painful day. So, while we celebrate mothering love in all it's forms (whether through the care of a biological child or not), we also hold in our prayers all those for whom 'mother' is a complicated word.

But today, more than just celebrating mothers and mothering love, I'd like to explore our image of God and ask whether we can celebrate the God who loves us as both mother and father. We're familiar with images of a male God, our heavenly Father, the bible offers a surprising amount of motherly images for God as well.

So perhaps today we might allow space in our picture of who God is for motherly love. A God who is tender and passionate with the love of a mother for her nursing child. Who invites us into a relationship as close and intimate as a sated child resting in its mothers arms. Perhaps we might picture God, not as the distant and authoritative father figure we sometimes suspect God is, but instead as offering a mother's gentle embrace to her beloved child, looking down with the besotted love to the infant cradled in her arms. How might that image shape the God we pray to?

But there's also more to mothering love than this image of gentle tenderness, and our gospel reading brings that out. Jesus speaks of his desire to gather the children of Jerusalem under his wings as a mother hen gathers her brood. But this image is one of sacrifice. A hen gathers her brood, under her wings only to protect them from danger. She shields her young with her own body when she sees them threatened. This is also a mother's love. Sacrifice and strength and determination. In Jesus we're offered just such a picture of sacrificial love. The God gives up his life to protect us from the threat of sin and death. Jesus loves as a mother does, sacrificing himself for the children of God.

Shout for joy, O heavens;

rejoice, O earth;

burst into song, O mountains!

For the LORD comforts his people

and will have compassion on his afflicted ones.

But Zion said, "The LORD has forsaken me,

the Lord has forgotten me."

"Can a mother forget the baby at her breast

and have no compassion on the child she has borne?

Though she may forget,

I will not forget you!

See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands;

your walls are ever before me.

Psalm 131

My heart is not proud, LORD, my eyes are not haughty; I do not concern myself with great matters or things too wonderful for me.

But I have calmed and quieted myself,
I am like a weaned child with its mother;
like a weaned child I am content.
Israel, put your hope in the LORD
both now and forevermore.

Gospel reading Luke 13.32-35

He said to them...'Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed away from Jerusalem." Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord."
