# Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> May 2022 Fifth Sunday of Easter

As we continue our post-Easter journey through Luke's story of the mission and ministry of the early church in the book of Acts, today we reach the watershed moment in that story, the conversion of Cornelius, when the shape of the early Christian community and its mission is broadened to include the Gentiles. Or rather, in the final abbreviated retelling of the story in this morning's reading, Peter's reporting of that decisive event to the church in Jerusalem and their less than enthusiastic reaction.

Luke has been preparing his readers for this moment for some time, but it still seems to take Peter a bit by surprise. But if it came as something of a surprise to Peter, it was a total shock to the early church in Jerusalem. Their concern, however, was not so much that Peter preached to these Gentiles nor even that he baptised them, but that he sat down and ate with them, crossing boundaries and overturning centuries of separation and exclusion and accepting them into fellowship with the new community of Jesus.

Mission, in words usually attributed to the former Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams, is 'finding out what God is doing and joining in'. Peter discovered to his surprise that God was already at work among the Gentiles. The challenge for the church today is to discover where God is already at work and to be willing to cross boundaries and break new ground in order to join in.

One of the ways in which we find God already at work is surely through Christian Aid. Today is the start of Christian Aid week, with the theme this year turning hunger into hope. Our support for and involvement in Christian Aid is every bit as much part of joining in the mission of God as anything we do locally. It's one way of showing that God's love can transcend all differences and that all are within the embrace of his love.

## First Reading: Acts 11.1-18

The apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a

trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?' When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'

## Gospel Reading: John 13.31-35

During the supper, when Judas had gone out, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you cannot come." I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'
