

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park

Sunday 14th August 2022 Nineth Sunday after Trinity

Most folk will be familiar with the traditional game of "Consequences", in which each participant adds a story line without knowing what has been written previously. The resulting completed document is usually surprising and fairly ridiculous. The readings for this 9th Sunday after Trinity also deal with consequences, and in the Gospel reading what we hear seems equally surprising.

Luke writes that Jesus has come to bring fire to the earth, in itself an awesome thought, and moreover the consequences of this will not be peace but rather division. Surely this can't be right, he mustn't have read the script, for we've previously been told the angelic message was "peace on earth"; and is not Jesus the Prince of Peace, bringing healing and reconciliation. We must try to make sense of all this.

In the second part of today's Gospel, which doesn't really seem to have much connection with the first part, Jesus criticises those who are adept at reading the signs for things that are temporal and relatively unimportant but are quite oblivious to matters of eternal concern and value. No consequences are mentioned there, but perhaps you could add your own line: "and the consequence of that was...."

The other readings appointed for today also speak of consequences. From Isaiah chapter 5 we hear of the dire consequences for a vineyard which refuses to produce good grapes despite all the landowner's loving care.

The epistle passage, which will not be read this morning, is from Hebrews chapter 11. It likewise reminds us of the awesome fate that befell many of God's servants in times past as a consequence of being faithful.

Isaiah 5.1-7

Let me sing for my beloved my love-song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill.

He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watch-tower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; he expected it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes.

And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard.
What more was there to do for my vineyard that I have not done in it?
When I expected it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes?

And now I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard. I will remove its hedge, and it shall be devoured: I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down. I will make it a waste: it shall not be pruned or hoed, and it shall be overgrown with briers and thorns; I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it. For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel. and the people of Judah are his pleasant planting; he expected justice, but saw bloodshed; righteousness, but heard a cry!

Luke 12.49-56

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what stress I am under until it is completed! Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division! From now on, five in one household will be divided, three against two and two against three; they will be divided:

father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.'

He also said to the crowds, 'When you see a cloud rising in the west, you immediately say, "It is going to rain"; and so it happens. And when you see the south wind blowing, you say, "There will be scorching heat"; and it happens. You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time?
