<u>Tribute to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II</u>

The whole nation will have been saddened to hear the news of the death of our Queen on Thursday. We will have several opportunities over the coming days to remember her and mark her life and reign, as well as to pray for our new King, Charles III, as he taken up the heavy burden of following his mother as monarch.

The late Queen has defined the monarchy for 70 years. For much of our nation she is the only monarch we have known. Even for those who remember her father, Elizabeth has shaped what it means to be monarch in a modern era. Her consistent dedication to duty; her unswerving sense that power and authority were to be exercised in service of others; and her profound faith have shaped a truly noble reign.

The Queen is quoted as saying: 'Throughout my life, the message and teachings of Christ have been my guide, and in them I find hope.' She has reflected those teachings in a life of public duty and offered a picture to the nation of Christian service and faith. As we both give thanks for her remarkable life and mourn her loss, we commend her into the hands of the Lord she served so well as our Queen. She will surely be received into the kingdom that awaits, welcomed by the King of all Kings and Queens, to hear the words: 'Well done, good and faithful servant.'

We will pray in the days to come, in thanks for her reign, and for King Charles as he begins his own. May he draw from his mother's example and may he and the whole Royal Family know God's comfort and peace as they grieve.

And may Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II rest in peace and rise in glory.

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners – of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Luke 15.1-10

All the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'
