

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park

Sunday 20th November 2022 Feast of Christ the King

This Sunday as we gather together as churches of the Parish of Christ the King, perhaps we might ask what Jesus' Kingship means for us. And three symbols from a King's coronation might help us do that, as they contrast with the King on a cross.

The first is a crown. The royal crown is decked with gold and gems, including the world's largest diamond. And yet Jesus was crowned with thorns. Where our world is enamoured with displays of status, Jesus was mocked and beaten. Where a king would be decked with riches, they stripped Jesus and cast lots for his clothes. Where a king would wear a crown of gold and gems, Jesus wears only thorns. The Kingship of Jesus has none of the markers of status. No wealth or opulence. How, as churches, can we leave behind our desire to project status, or hold on to wealth? How can we radically follow Jesus as a King who had nothing, as we serve him in our mission to the world?

The second is the orb and sceptre placed in a King's hands. Symbols of wisdom and authority given to rule. And yet Jesus had nails put in his hands and was hung on a cross to die. As they were driven through his flesh he prayed: 'Father forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' The wisdom and authority of Jesus rule is not the 'wisdom of the wise' or authority to command. It is the foolishness of the cross, and the prayer of forgiveness. Not a governor decreeing from on high, but a man who forgives as nails pierce his hands. How, as churches, might we follow his wisdom, trusting in the power of forgiveness and the path of the cross?

And finally, a throne. A king is seated on a throne as the final symbol of power. From there his rule is absolute. And yet Jesus's throne is a cross. It is there that his power was shown as he gave his life for the whole world. It is in a moment of sacrifice that Jesus became our true King. This is the power of God, the power that now reigns forever in all the glory, splendour and majesty of heaven. A power that is crowned with thorns, with nails in his hands, and enthroned on a cross. The King of love shows the power of God in giving himself for us. How as churches can we love as he loved us, and tell the story of his grace.

Jeremiah 23.1-6

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the LORD. Therefore thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the LORD. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the LORD. The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness.'

Luke 23.33-43

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' Jesus replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'
