Sunday 11th December 2022 Third Sunday of Advent

What did you expect? You might ask that of yourself or someone else when an experience you have been looking forward to turns out to be.. a bit ordinary.. unexciting. Maybe you paid for tickets to see a new exhibition – but were underwhelmed by it. Maybe you'd been looking forward to a concert at the Sage by someone famous – but when you went you couldn't quite see why they'd had so many rave reviews. Perhaps you'd treated the family to a meal at a rather nice restaurant – and the food just didn't seem worth the money. You feel totally let down.

John the Baptist must have felt let down. He is in prison. This high profile preacher, who had seen crowds flocking to listen to him, who had dared to shout at the authorities and told everyone to repent because God's kingdom was coming near. He promoted Jesus as bringing a baptism of the Holy Spirit and of fire: destroying those who lived lives opposed to what God was doing. But in prison, he has little to do except think – and doubt everything he hoped for. So he seeks answers. And Jesus points to what he is doing. Doing God's work, transforming lives. But it doesn't fit with John's preconceptions. He is asking "If the Messiah has come, where is his kingdom? Why don't things look a lot better than they do?" There are after all, so many things wrong in the world. Jesus goes on to point out that many people in this world want to tell God to play by their rules, to dance to their tunes, to show power according to their definitions of what power is. But you can't win with people like that. John lived an austere life, and the world called him disturbed. Jesus lived an exuberant life, and the world called him a pleasure seeker. You can't let such people dictate what your life or your faith should look like. So with John the Baptist, we are called to faith in the good news which God brought to the lost, the lonely and the distressed. Only the Holy Spirit can show us this truth. And if we can see it at all, this is cause for praise and thanksgiving!

Isaiah 35.1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The alory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, 'Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert: the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp, the grass shall become reeds and rushes. A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people; no traveller, not even fools, shall go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. And the ransomed of the LORD shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Matthew 11.2-11

When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples and said to Jesus, 'Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?' Jesus answered them, 'Go and tell John what you hear and see: the

blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. And blessed is anyone who takes no offence at me.'

As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written,

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way before you."

Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.'
