Sunday 19th March 2023 Mothering Sunday

In this week's Gospel reading Jesus makes provisions for his mother as he's dying on the cross. Not the cheeriest subject for Mother's Day but an important one. He does more than ask the disciple to check on her or give her some financial support. He makes a very strong statement.

'Woman, here is your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

In our age of nuclear family, it seems like a lot to ask. We live in a society where it's still unusual for parents to move in with their children even with the current cost of living crisis. It would be considered very unusual to move a friend's mother in with.

We often make a distinction between community and family. Community can be a very warm and supportive thing but it's not quite the same as family. With family we can be more vulnerable and often less polite. Family can be dysfunctional and unpleasant too.

Jesus doesn't make those distinctions. As children of God the Christian community that we're baptised into is encouraged to be family. To be more than polite. Family can be difficult but if it's built on love and forgiveness, it can be real and vulnerable. knowing that you belong somewhere you are known completely and still completely loved despite your faults, failings or disagreements is the best kind of family and that's what Jesus offers us.

Mary isn't an inconvenient lodger in the disciples home she is a mother to him and he is a son to her. They are brought together by a shared grief but more importantly a shared love and a greater understanding of what that love means, in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Colossians 3.12-17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

John 19:25-27

Standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, 'Woman, here is your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.
