

# Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park

## Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2023 Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week and the journey towards the cross. The week begins on a joyful note, with Jesus triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The crowds acclaim him as king, and Jesus tells the Pharisees: 'I tell you, if these [the crowd] were silent, the stones would shout out.' Jesus is king and all the world must know it! And, of course, the week ends with joy, as this king rises from the dead on Easter morning.

Two great pinnacles of the drama of Holy Week, but between them we walk with Jesus into the deep valley of betrayal and rejection and trial and death. We follow Jesus through his last supper and his agonised prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane on Maundy Thursday; his arrest and crucifixion on Good Friday; and the dark empty day of waiting that is Holy Saturday. As we enter this most holy of weeks, we follow Jesus on a journey from the pinnacle of Palm Sunday to the deep valley of Good Friday, before we reach Easter.

It's a trajectory that Paul wonderfully writes of in his letter to the Philippians, a passage often set for Palm Sunday, and which we'll use as our affirmation of faith. Jesus goes from glory to greater glory, but through the downward path of self-emptying, self-giving, sacrificial love. This Holy Week, we follow Jesus on that path.

though he was in the form of God,

he did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself,

taking the form of a slave,

being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form,

he humbled himself

and became obedient to the point of death-

even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him

and gave him the name that is above every name,

so that at the name of Jesus

every knee should bend,

in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

and every tongue should confess

that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (Phil 2.5-11)
