

# Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park

## Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> April 2023 Fourth Sunday of Easter

This Sunday is St Aidan's AGM, and offers a chance to reflect on the life of our church, and our hopes and prayers for our future. Over Lent we offered a chance for members of the church to give their thoughts and feedback. The DCC, with others who wanted to join the process, met to go through that feedback and discuss our responses, and you can see the results on the board at the back of church.

The word that particularly emerged for me through those discussions is growth. What does it look like to grow as a church? What are the challenges and joys that it brings? How do we seek to be a growing church? And as I asked those questions I was struck by the image of a seed.

Growth is what living things do, and churches seek to grow as they bear witness to the living God, and the life of Christ at work within us. That growth may be in depth of faith and prayer, in witness and action in our communities, or in numbers who gather in worship.

As Jesus' parable teaches us, to grow, a seed must find good soil. It can't grow without rich ground. We are a church with much rich soil to draw from. Welcome and fellowship were among the most used words in our responses. We want to continue to be a friendly, supportive and welcoming community. We are also rooted in and nourished by worship the Anglican tradition. We draw sustenance from its heritage and its liturgy, and we will always draw from that.

But to grow a seed also has to change. A seed of wheat must sprout from the soil, a stem must reach higher and spread out, that in turn must form an ear, which must bring forth grain. To be a church that grows will mean change. It will mean embracing the adventure of following where God leads as we seek to welcome new people with different needs and ways of approaching God.

Growth is both a challenge and a joy, but ultimately I believe that the life of God is at work within us as a church, and it's only by that life that we see growth – whether in depth of prayer, in service and outreach to our community, or in numbers who gather to worship. I hope we can embrace the challenge and joy of that together in the years to come, and I very much pray that we will continue to grow in every way!

#### 1 Corinthians 3.5-9

What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labour of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building.

#### Matthew 13.1-9

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the lake. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: 'Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!'
