

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park Sunday 28th May 2023 PENTECOST

On this feast of Pentecost we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. It's a day that marks the beginning of the church's mission to go from Jerusalem, to Samaria and the ends of the earth as they tell the good news of Jesus. But it's a day that both sends out and draws in: an explosion and an implosion.

So first this is the day that the church is sent to the world. As the disciples gather together in prayer, this is the great explosion of missional energy that sends the gospel to reach every corner of the globe. The very first thing that the disciples do after the Holy Spirit comes to them is tell people about God. The Holy Spirit isn't sent for the sake of a cosy feeling of God's presence, or to give an exciting spiritual high, it's sent to allow the church to proclaim the gospel in word and deed. And just as then, so today, the Holy Spirit calls the church to the same. From our prayer we're sent out in mission and service. On Sunday we will finish our worship with some questions asking 'will you dare...' So will we dare to allow the Spirit to be at work within us, as we faithfully try to follow where God leads? I hope that together we can say: 'we will.'

But the day of Pentecost, just as it sends the disciples out in mission, is also about drawing in, as God gathers the nations to himself. An implosion as well as an explosion, as we see the disciples given the gift of speaking in other languages. In this moment we see the work of the Holy Spirit as God speaks across the boundaries of tribe and nation and language. This is God drawing all people to himself, just as Jesus promised. And perhaps, as we come to the end of a period particularly set apart for prayer, we might recognise the power and importance of prayer in that drawing in. The Holy Spirit, in prayer, enables us to hear God's word to us in our own language, in our native tongue. God speaks in the way that we can hear, unique to us and our way of understanding and experiencing him. We hear that God pours out his Holy Spirit on young and old, men and women, slave and free alike. Whoever we are, as we set apart time in prayer to open the ears of our hearts, we hear him speak to us through the gift of his Holy Spirit.

Acts 2.1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

"In the last days it will be, God declares,

that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,

and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,

and your young men shall see visions,

and your old men shall dream dreams.

Even upon my slaves, both men and women,

in those days I will pour out my Spirit;

and they shall prophesy.

And I will show portents in the heaven above

and signs on the earth below,

blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

The sun shall be turned to darkness

and the moon to blood,

before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

John 20.19-23

It was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'
