

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park Sunday 7th May 2023 Fifth Sunday of Easter

On Saturday, we marked a historic day for our nation as King Charles III was crowned. As we celebrate that day and all that it means, there are two parts of the Coronation service that stand out for me. The first is the prayer that the King prayed after he made his oaths as he said:

God of compassion and mercy whose Son was sent not to be served but to serve, give grace that I may find in thy service perfect freedom and in that freedom knowledge of thy truth.

Grant that I may be a blessing to all thy children, of every faith and conviction, that together we may discover the ways of gentleness and be led into the paths of peace. through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

And the second is the moment of anointing as the Archbishop of Canterbury prays:

Be your hands anointed with holy oil.
Be your breast anointed with holy oil.
Be your head anointed with holy oil,
as kings, priests, and prophets were anointed.

And as Solomon was anointed king by Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet, so may you be anointed, blessed, and consecrated King over the peoples, whom the Lord your God has given you to rule and govern; in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

This Coronation is rooted in the idea of a sacred Kingly service. It's an idea that makes little sense without the example of Christ. Jesus' teaching and example suffuses this ceremony as he says: 'the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves.' This historic ceremony, perhaps asks us to see the Holy Spirit at work in all the complexities of power and leadership to offer an image, not of selfish gain, but of duty and service. It is an idea fast fading from wider culture, but perhaps King Charles might re-direct us to the example Christ, our Servant King. And in all the complexities of our world and our lives, perhaps we too might know this sacred call to follow him as his anointed servants.

1 Kings 3.4-10

At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon during the night in a dream, and God said, "Ask for whatever you want me to give you."

Solomon answered, "You have shown great kindness to your servant, my father David, because he was faithful to you and righteous and upright in heart. You have continued this great kindness to him and have given him a son to sit on his throne this very day.

"Now, Lord my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David. But I am only a little child and do not know how to carry out my duties. Your servant is here among the people you have chosen, a great people, too numerous to count or number. So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong. For who is able to govern this great people of yours?" The Lord was pleased that Solomon had asked for this.

Luke 22.24-30

A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

'You are those who have stood by me in my trials; and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.
