

# Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park Sunday 28th May 2023 Trinity Sunday

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday, the one day a year we intentionally set aside to reflect on the doctrine of the Holy Trinity. It's a doctrine that is well known for being theologically difficult, as we speak of One God, in Three Persons, but our reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians maybe gives us a way to approach it. Paul signs off his letter praying for the grace of Jesus, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit.

So first we hear of the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, who is sent by the Father, and anointed by the Spirit, to offer salvation to the world. This is the Trinity in action. It is the sending of God's self to the world, through the life, death and resurrection of the Son. Jesus as the eternal Son, fully human and fully divine, offers the greatest free gift of love that God could offer. He offers the life of God, given for us on a cross, and bursting afresh from an empty tomb. And this is grace. The Father sends the Son, so that by the Spirit there is nothing that can separate us from his love. The eternal Trinity stoops to earth and become one of us, so that we could know who God truly is. God gives Godself to the world in Jesus and even death cannot hold it back. This is the grace of the Son.

Then Paul speaks of the love of God. For me this is heart of the doctrine of the Trinity. That it is about love. Only the Trinity makes sense of John's claim in his letter that 'God is love' (1 John 4.16). Because love is dynamic, not static; love is discovered in relationship, not in isolation; love is given and received not simply held. So if God *is* love, there must be a dynamic relationship of love at God's heart. And this is exactly what the Trinity is. St Augustine spoke of the Father, Son and Spirit as the Lover, the Beloved and the Love Between them. An eternal communion of perfect love at the heart of God.

And finally Paul prays for the communion of the Holy Spirit. Because while the Trinity loves perfectly and eternally, that love overflows into God's creation, and the Holy Spirit draws us into communion with that love. Through the Holy Spirit, we are caught up in the love of God, able to receive and return the love of God, and offer and receive that love to others. This is the communion of the Spirit.

So the Holy Trinity from the eternal love of God, sends grace to the world through the Son, and draws us into communion by the Spirit. Surely that's something to be wondered at, at least once a year!

### 2 Corinthians 13.11-13

Brothers and sisters, put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

#### Matthew 28.16-end

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'
