

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park Sunday 11th June 2023 St Barnabas

"A good man, full of the Holy Spirit and Faith"

On this Sunday, June 11th, we are asked to remember St Barnabas. He is usually regarded as a minor character in the New Testament, but do you realize what he accomplished? Although he never wrote a word of Scripture (so far as we know), you could argue he was responsible for over half the New Testament. Think of it this way. The two people he influenced the most were Saul of Tarsus (later to be called Paul) and John Mark.

Paul wrote 13 books of the New Testament and John Mark went on to write the gospel which bears his name. That's 14 out of 27 books. Not a bad record for a man most people would consider a "minor" Bible character. We know a surprising amount about him: he came from Cyprus but seems to have been living in Jerusalem. He was of the priestly tribe of Levi and was a cousin of John Mark. We encounter him early in Acts when his generosity is highlighted as he sells a plot of land he owned and gives the proceeds to the apostles to help those of the church in need. Later we see him involved in other "aid missions" along with Paul.

His generosity was not limited to material possessions but extended to generosity in his judgements of others. So when Paul's dramatic conversion on the Damascus Road was being looked on with suspicion by the apostles in Jerusalem, Barnabas trusted him and brought him in to the fellowship: incidentally this also shows that Barnabas' personal reputation was high enough to carry such weight with the others. Also, when John Mark fell out of favour with Paul after "deserting" in the middle of a mission, Barnabas defended him, even though it caused a sharp disagreement between himself and Paul and offered him a second chance.

He was originally called Joses, or Joseph, but was later given the name Barnabas by the apostles. The name means "son of encouragement" and we can presume he was so called for very good reason. It seems he never wanted to be a "front man" but delighted in supporting and encouraging others and rejoicing in their success under God. That was his great gift which he brought to his ministry.

This gift of encouragement is surely one of the gifts most needed in our churches and indeed in our world today. If only every parish and every society could be replete with people like Barnabas who could encourage the unloved and unlovely, give hope to those who have no hope, and share the burdens of those who are staggering under their weight.

We could use a whole lot more like Barnabas, because we all need a whole lot of encouragement.

Acts 11:19-30

Those who were scattered because of the persecution that took place over Stephen travelled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch, and they spoke the word to no one except Jews. But among them were some men of Cyprus and Cyrene who, on coming to Antioch, spoke to the Hellenists also, proclaiming the Lord Jesus. The hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number became believers and turned to the Lord. News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they met with the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'.

At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea; this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

John 15: 12-17

Jesus said to his disciples: 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.'
