

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park Sunday 2nd July 2023 St Peter's Day

This Sunday we're marking St Peter's Day. This is the time of the church year when new Deacons and Priests are traditionally ordained, and this afternoon Hannah Malcolm our new curate will be among them. It's also a good time to reflect on our calling, and our vocation. Not just for those who are called to ordained ministry, but for all who are called to love and follow Christ.

In our gospel reading from the end of John's Gospel, we see a question and answer as Jesus entrusts Peter with the gift of a ministry. So first the question: 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' This is the question at the heart of all vocation. This is the question Jesus asks as he entrusts his people with his work. 'Do you love me?': one simple requirement, one sustaining relationship, one un-ending adventure, that underpins everything we do as the church. It's a question Jesus asks three times, and Peter is hurt as he hears in the third a reminder of his betrayal of Jesus. Yet he replies: 'Lord, you know everything, you know that I love you.' So as Jesus asks us this question, we answer not because our love is perfect; not because we think we'll never stumble; not because we're the shining image of a spotless disciple. We answer despite our flaws and our failings; despite our sometimes half-heartedness; despite our forgetfulness and our distraction; despite our fears and our denials. But still we're asked the question, and we each search the depths of our hearts to respond.

And if we answer as Peter did, saying: 'Lord you know everything, you know that I love you', then the calling follows. On this one simple requirement Jesus entrusts us with his work. Jesus says to Peter: 'Feed my lambs', 'Tend my sheep', Feed my sheep'. We have often read this as a call to lead and care for the church, which in part it is. But it is more than that, this is Jesus entrusting the work of the Good Shepherd to his whole church. It's Jesus saying that into our flawed and frail hands, he places the gift of all those who he loves and calls to himself. Those inside the church and out. That is the vocation: 'feed my lambs, tend my sheep'. It is a profound and weighty gift, and one we're not ready for, but then neither was Peter, and Jesus only asked one thing of him. So perhaps today Jesus is asking each of us that one question: 'Do you love me?' and if we answer as Peter did, then he's asking us to get ready for the calling to come!

1 Peter 2.21-end

For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. 'He committed no sin,

and no deceit was found in his mouth.'

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

John 21.15-19

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'
