# Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> January 2024 Candlemas

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, also known as Candlemas It falls 40 days after Christmas, so the actual date of the Presentation is 2nd. February, (Friday), but we are celebrating it today. It marks the end of the Christmas/Epiphany season. It is also known as the feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, though the concept of "purifying" a woman after childbirth would not be generally acceptable today.

The name "Candlemas" comes from the tradition in some churches of blessing on this Sunday the candles to be used in the coming year. Candles are a very natural symbol for light of course, and this season now ending is very much associated with the theme of light: - we think of Christ as the light of the world, and the light of the gospel spreading throughout the world. Indeed next Sunday the theme continues as we will then hear St John's interpretation of the incarnation in which he proclaims Jesus as the life that is the light of all mankind.

The gospel reading is St Luke's account of the visit to the temple of Mary and Joseph and the almost six-week-old Jesus to fulfil the requirements of the law set out in Exodus 13 and Leviticus 12. There they are greeted by two elderly "parishioners" Simeon and Anna. It's just an ordinary human-interest story, at least until we hear what Simeon has to say.

By contrast, the prophet Malachi's vision of the Lord coming to his temple is far from innocent. If people were self-confidently looking forward to this promised event, they should be careful: it may not be pleasant for them. He will be like a fire that purifies, he will judge like one who refines silver. So who then will be able to stand before him when he appears?

#### Malachi 3.1-5

Thus says the Lord God: See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight – indeed, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the LORD in righteousness. Then the offering of

Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the LORD of hosts.

#### Luke 2.22-40

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word;

for my eyes have seen your salvation,

which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

a light for revelation to the Gentiles

and for glory to your people Israel.'

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed – and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.
