

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park Sunday 5th May 2024 Easter 6

In our Gospel passage this week, Jesus makes a remarkable statement. He calls his disciples, and through them calls us, his friends. Perhaps we're so used to the idea of Jesus as our friend that we miss what an incredible statement this is. So perhaps take a step back and look at what Jesus is saying. Jesus, who the disciples call Teacher and Lord; Jesus, who is God's own Son; Jesus, the word of God made flesh, says that we are not simply servants of a commanding master, but are his friends. This isn't the kind of relationship God is supposed to have with his creation, and yet Jesus promises us a friendship so profound that he would lay down his life for us.

What does that friendship mean to you? Perhaps it's the presence of a constant companion by your side. Or the voice of a kind counsellor guiding you on your way. Perhaps the hand of a friend to lift you up when you stumble, and to lean on when you feel weak. The friendship of Jesus is all of these things and more.

In return he asks that we be friends to him, by following one simple, and yet deeply challenging commandment: to love one another as he has loved us. This week, may we be friends of Jesus, and show his friendship to others.

Acts 10.44-48

While Peter was speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

John 15.9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.'
