

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Brunton Park Sunday 1st September 2024 St Aidan Patronal Festival

In our scripture readings for St Aidan's day, we get a beautiful picture of Jesus spending time among the people of his region, having compassion for those he met. His ministry flowed from the compassionate attention he offered, and he instructed his disciples to go out in the same spirit. Their feet must have been very dusty from constantly walking around the local communities. But their feet were nevertheless beautiful, as our Isaiah reading puts it, because they came with good news: God's comfort for his people. Several hundred years later, St Aidan was a disciple cut from the same cloth. Aidan followed the patten that Jesus gave, walking slowly and lovingly amongst his people. This unhurried, compassionate love brought the church to the north-east. We live in a culture which wants to move quickly, unwilling to be distracted by the needs of others. But that's not how Jesus walks with us. Jesus walks slowly alongside us, at the pace we are traveling, looking at us with compassion.

Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices; together they shout for joy, for in plain sight they see the return of the LORD to Zion. Break forth; shout together for joy, you ruins of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Matthew 9:35–38

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."
