Sunday 13th April 2025 Palm Sunday

Each year, our Palm Sunday service disrupts our usual Sunday morning pattern of readings. Rather than focusing on one or two moments in scripture, we are invited to zoom out, taking in the whole passion narrative in one sweep. We begin with the busy joy and excitement of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. But as we listen to Luke's account of holy week unfold, the cheering crowds and supporters quickly fall away, and they betray Jesus instead. In the end, Jesus is almost entirely alone.

As we reflect on the whole sweep of the passion, let's recall just how many different accounts and memories Luke has gathered in order to tell us this story. The male disciples have had to admit their failures. The women who followed Jesus have relived their grief. The words Jesus speaks at his death have been whispered and wondered about and passed on in the early Christian community. And here we are, two millennia later, joining in the story, and finding our own way to witness to the love Jesus offers us.
