Sunday 11th May 2025 4th Sunday of Easter

This Sunday is the start of Christian Aid week. It's a time dedicated to highlighting the work of Christian Aid all over the world and encouraging each of us to think about how we can generously join in, whether through acting, praying, or giving. Our gospel reading for this service reminds why we are called to live generously: we have first received the generous love of Jesus, who has compassion on us when we feel helpless, and provides us with more than enough to share. In the generous love of Jesus, we have everything we need to help us show generosity to others, trusting in his abundant provision.

Joel 1 10-20

The fields are devastated, the ground mourns; for the grain is destroyed, the wine dries up, the oil fails. Be dismayed, you farmers, wail, you vine-dressers, over the wheat and the barley; for the crops of the field are ruined. The vine withers, the fig tree droops. Pomegranate, palm, and apple— all the trees of the field are dried up; surely, joy withers away among the people. Put on sackcloth and lament, you priests; wail, you ministers of the altar. Come, pass the night in sackcloth, you ministers of my God! Grain-offering and drink-offering are withheld from the house of your God. Sanctify a fast, call a solemn assembly. Gather the elders and all the inhabitants of the land to the house of the LORD your God, and cry out to the LORD. Alas for the day! For the day of the LORD is near, and as destruction from the Almighty lit comes. Is not the food cut off before our eyes, joy and gladness from the house of our God?¹⁷The seed shrivels under the clods, the storehouses are desolate; the granaries are ruined because the grain has failed. How the animal's groan! The herds of cattle wander about because there is no pasture for them; even the flocks of sheep are dazed to you, O LORD, I cry. For fire has devoured the pastures of the wilderness, and flames have burned all the trees of the field. Even the wild animals cry to you because the watercourses are dried up, and fire has devoured the pastures of the wilderness.

Mark 6 34-44

As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things. ³⁵ When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; ³⁶ send them away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat.' ³⁷ But he answered them, 'You give them something to eat.' They said to him, 'Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii^[]] worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?' ³⁸ And he said to them, 'How many loaves have you? Go and see.' When they had found out, they said, 'Five, and two fish.' ³⁹ Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰ So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. ⁴¹ Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and he divided the two fish among them all. ⁴² And all ate and were filled; ⁴³ and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. ⁴⁴ Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.
