Sunday 25th May 2025 6th Sunday of Easter

Today's two Bible readings both feature a question, one direct - Jesus asks the disabled man by the pool near the Sheep Gate in Jerusalem 'Do you want to be made well?' - and one indirect - Paul, on what is now the northwest coast of Turkey, sees a vision of a man across the Aegean Sea in Greece asking, pleading with him 'Will you come over and help us?' Both questions are surprising – would the man who had been ill for 38 years not want to be made well? And crossing the Aegean to Greece wasn't part of Paul's plan at all. Had we also had the Old Testament reading this morning we would have had a third surprising question – Ezekiel sees in a vision a valley of dry bones, representing the people of Israel in exile in Babylon, and God asks him 'Can these bones live?' In all three cases the answer to the question is 'Yes', however uncertain or unexpected. But in all three cases, that 'yes' leads to a transformation of the situation though the positive action of God, of Jesus, and of the Holy Spirit. Are we today prepared for God to ask us unexpected or surprising questions and ready to say 'yes' to God and, like Paul, 'yes' to those asking us to come and help them and transform their situation

Acts 16, 9-15

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.' When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain

woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, 'If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.' And she prevailed upon us.

John 5, 1-9

After this there was a festival of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. Now in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate there is a pool, called in Hebrew Beth-zatha¹ which has five porticoes. In these lay many invalids—blind, lame, and paralysed One man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been there a long time, he said to him, 'Do you want to be made well?' ⁷ The sick man answered him, 'Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; and while I am making my way, someone else steps down ahead of me.' Jesus said to him, 'Stand up, take your mat and walk.' At once the man was made well, and he took up his mat and began to walk.
