

The Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Church Brunton Park

Sunday 3rd August 2025 Trinity 7

In our gospel reading Jesus tells the parable of a rich farmer, who wants to store riches for himself. He tears down his barns to hoard yet more wealth, before finally, he thinks to himself, he can take it easy. And yet, that very night he dies. It's a parable that reminds us that, as colloquial wisdom has it, 'you can't take it with you.' More importantly though, we're asked what we're building with this one life we get. Are we hoarding things to ourselves, building ever bigger barns for all that we've accumulated, waiting for that day that never quite seems to come when we'll finally have enough? Or are we building something with lasting value. A treasure that will endure beyond this life and into the next. Are we rich in love? Have we stored up kindness and generosity? Have we accumulated wisdom, compassion, and faithfulness? These things are true treasure. So what are you building?

Hosea 11.1-4, 8-9

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.

The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols.

³ Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. ⁴ I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them.

8 How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. ⁹ I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath.

Luke 12.13-21

Someone in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me.' ¹⁴But he said to him, 'Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?' ¹⁵And he said to them, 'Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' ¹⁶Then he told them a parable: 'The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷And he thought to himself, "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?" ¹⁸Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." ²⁰But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" ²¹So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God.'
