

The Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Church Brunton Park Sunday 16th November 2025 Second Sunday before Advent

As we head towards the season of Advent, we're already in apocalyptic territory with this week's Gospel passage. Jesus tells of the destruction of the temple, and the signs of things to come. This passage, and others like it, often make for uncomfortable reading in a modern world. But perhaps that's the point. Perhaps they're supposed to ask us whether we've got our priorities right, or whether they've slipped off course.

Does Jesus' prophecy of destruction, speak to the temples that we've built? Have we created something that takes the place of God in our worship and our lives? Have we built a temple, in our churches, in our habits, in our ambitions, instead of being the people of God? Perhaps sometimes we need to hear words that tell us that, in the end, nothing will stand that isn't God's handiwork. Nothing that we create to put in his place can last, because ultimately, as God draws all things to himself, everything that is not his, and is not of him, will have to fall.

These are difficult, uncomfortable words, but perhaps that's the point. So what temple might Jesus be needing to tear down for you, and how will faithfulness to God replace it?

Malachi 4. 1 - 2a

See, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble; the day that comes shall burn them up, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall.

Luke 21. 5 - 19

When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.'

They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' And he said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.

When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately. Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.

But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.
