Sunday 2nd November 2025 All Saints

This Sunday we'll be marking two important days in the Christian year: All Saints, and All Souls. The two are connected in the act of remembering those who have gone before us in the faith. All Saints gives thanks for those people, whether in history, or in our own experience, who have been a witness to us of how to live a life of faith in Christ. All Souls, remembers all those we have loved, giving thanks that in faith, they now rest with God in heaven.

Each of these days serves as a both a chance to look back in thanksgiving, and an encouragement to look forward in hope. As we look to the lives of those who have inspired our faith, so we're also called to look forward to how we choose to live our own lives. We don't just give thanks for the Saints, we're called to join them! Our lives can be lived so that future generations might look back and remember us as the one who inspired their own faith. And they in turn can do the same for the next generation, and the next, and so the faith is passed on. That is the call of the Saints, and it's a call we joyfully take up. As the hymn famously has it: 'Oh how I want to be in that number, when the Saints go marching in!'

Ephesians 1:11-16

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, I having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory. I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers.

Luke 6: 20 - 31

Then he looked up at his disciples and said:

Blessed are you who are poor,

for yours is the kingdom of God. 'Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.

'Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

'But woe to you who are rich,

for you have received your consolation.

Woe to you who are full now,

for you will be hungry.

Woe to you who are laughing now,

for you will mourn and weep.

'Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

'But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you.
